Her book, *Quirky Scenes for Drama Kings and Queens* is a popular scene book used by drama teachers for class work, eisteddfods and exams. Pamela is currently working on another collection.

Over the years, she has worked extensively in theatre TV commercials, voice-overs, Television series and film. Her former theatre company *Theatrevision* was devoted to the performance of Shakespeare and the classics and Australian Literature for Young People.

Late entries will attract a fee of \$5. - No late entries after June 3rd.


Entry fees will not be refunded if the competitor is unable to attend the eisteddfod for any reason.

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#### **GENERAL EISTEDDFOD RULES**

#### It is important that competitors and teachers read the following rules.

- 1. These Rules apply to Music, Dance and Speech and Drama sections of The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Society Inc.
- Rules and Conditions as printed in the Schedules and Programmes are valid for, and continue to be valid for, the period of the Eisteddfod.
- 3. Competitors, teachers, parents and guardians will be regarded as being conversant with the rules of the Society. Lack of knowledge will not be accepted as a bona fide reason for the infringement of any rule.
- 4. Items are open to amateurs only. "Amateurs" are persons who do not earn the major portion of their income from the practice of Music, Dance, or Speech and Drama. Amateurs include individuals who have spot-parts in Theatrical Performance, Concerts, sporadic events and advertising campaigns.
- 5. Competitors compete at their own risk.
- 6. The Committee reserves the following rights:
  - to amend the programme as necessary.
  - to refuse any entry.
  - to ask any competitor to provide proof of age.
  - to appoint a substitute adjudicator.
  - to adjudicate on any misinterpretation of these rules.
  - to adjudicate on any issue not covered by these rules.
  - to divide an item if there are excessive entries.
  - to cancel an item if there are insufficient entries.
  - to combine age groups if there are insufficient entries.
- 7. Decisions of the Committee are final and binding on all matters.
- 8. Protests must be in writing, signed and lodged with the convenor within half an hour of the reason for the protest occurring. Protests must be accompanied by a \$10.00 fee. This amount forfeited if the protest is considered invalid, or is over-ruled by the Committee. Protests can be made only by competitors, their teachers, parents or guardians.
- 9. The adjudicator's decision is final within the bounds of the Rules and Conditions.
- 10. The adjudicator has the discretion, following concurrence with the Committee, to withhold a prize.
- 11. All Awards and Bursaries are awarded at the discretion of the Adjudicator and/or the relevant committees.
- 12. Adjudication sheets will be available, free of charge, at the conclusion of each item. These may be obtained at the rear of the venue.
- 13. Competitors, teachers, parents, guardians or other interested parties, shall not discuss competition related matters with the adjudicator. Communication with the adjudicator at the adjudication station is forbidden. All enquiries shall be directed to the Convenor.
- 14. Competitors must report to the Conductor of Sessions before the start of an item. Permission to compete will not be granted to any competitor who has not reported before the final performance has begun in an item.
- 15. Competitors must not perform out of the order as printed in the programme, without prior permission of the Convenor or the Deputy.
- 16. All persons wishing to enter the venue must purchase an entry ticket. Competitors may present their *Acknowledgement Statement* (receipt) for free admission to the session in which they are competing, but not to other sessions.
- 17. Naked flames or fuelled lamps will not be allowed on stage under any circumstances.
- 18. Any competitor who uses a prop in an unsafe manner, or who acts in a manner that could result in personal injury or property damage, while on stage or backstage, will be disqualified.
- 19. If a 240V extension lead is required, it will be provided by the Convenor. Please notify the Convenor one (1) month prior to the start of the Eisteddfod.
- 20. Competitors must wear suitable footwear at all times when side stage.
- 21. Collection and engraving of trophies is the responsibility of the winners.
- 22. Photocopying facilities are not available at the venue.

- 23. **ALL** Competitors **MUST** present themselves to the Session presenter ahead of their item. **ALL** competitors **MUST** remain with their fellow competitors at the front of the auditorium until the placings and/or results for that item have been awarded.
- 24. The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Speech and Drama Committee reserves the right to withdraw prize money from items with an insufficient number of competitors.

#### We promote student development, aiming to provide appropriate challenges for all competitors.

- 25. No competitor may perform a piece they have previously performed at the Ipswich Speech Eisteddfod. **SPEECH and DRAMA Rules**
- 1. All items are OWN CHOICE unless otherwise stated. A copy of OWN CHOICE pieces must be provided for the Adjudicator. Labelled folders will be placed outside the performance venue before the start of each session. Selections must be endorsed with the item and competitor number in the top, right hand corner; placed in the correct order within the folder. Folders will remain on the table until the beginning of the item.
- 2. OWN CHOICE pieces must be suitable to be performed publicly at a junior eisteddfod, and not previously performed at the Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod. (Exceptions for Anniversary Items 2021)
- 4. OWN CHOICE pieces cannot be used for more than one (1) item in the Eisteddfod.
- 5. Set pieces are available through the speech convenor to ensure the correct version is used.
- 6. Prompts may only be given from the Adjudicator's table.
- 7. Competitors in Impromptu Reading and Improvisation Items, who are not present when called by the Conductor of Sessions, will be automatically excluded.
- 8. Awards and Bursaries will be awarded by the Adjudicator. See Awards and Bursaries.
- 9. To be eligible to compete in the Recitation Championship items, competitors must perform in BOTH Age Group Items A Poetry Item (Australian or Non Australian or Humorous) **AND** a Prose Speaking Item.
  - a) Recitation Australian OR Non Australian OR Humorous Poem
  - b) Prose Speaking
- 10. Competitors in Recitation Championship Items must NOT perform out of the set session order.
- 12. To be eligible for the Aggregate Awards competitors must perform in each of the following sections:
  - a. Recitation Australian Poem or Non Australian poem
  - b. Prose Speaking
  - c. Impromptu Reading
  - d. Drama. Either Character Poem or Character Recital
- 13. The adjudicator has the discretion, following concurrence with the committee, to withhold a prize.
- 14. The Aggregate Awards will be given to competitors who have performed and attained the highest combined aggregate points in the relevant items. Aggregate points are given on the basis of four points for 1st place, three points for 2nd place, two points for 3rd place and one point for VHC and HC place. In the event of a tie, the adjudication marks will be used to determine the winner.
- 15. MUSICAL THEATRE Musical Theatre item must contain at least 50% dialogue and the remainder as dramatic communication through integrated singing, acting, dance/choreographed movement. **Competitors to provide own music**. The competitor will be marked on characterization, staging and understanding of context. If possible, age ranges will be catered for.

There is a full weighted electric piano for your accompanist to use (we do not provide an accompanist). Or you may use the CD player; Or you may use a USB into the CD Player; Or you may prefer to use a Mobile phone through the speaker. If you choose your mobile phone you MUST bring your own chord to connect into the speaker. Please be sure to arrive early to check your music will work.

16. First, second or third place winners in any item of The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Society's Speech and Drama Eisteddfod in the previous year are **not** eligible for the Recitation Consolation Items.

- 17. First Place winners in Individual, Championship items or Bursary winners are not eligible for Encouragement Awards.
- 18. In the Humorous Verse and Humorous Prose items, a costume and/or a prop may be used for the purpose of enhancing work.
- 19. In the Prepared Bible Reading items, the New Living Translation Bible will be provided. Competitors may either:
  - a) Read the text directly from the Bible
  - b) Read from a printout of the text placed in the open Bible
- 20. **TIME LIMITS** are <u>maximum times</u> and will be **strictly enforced**. 30 sec warning bells for improvisations, mimes, speeches and 'one minute please'; and final bell.
- 21. Competitors in individual items may perform only once in any item, while exemptions can be made for partnered items to allow odd numbers of competitors to participate.
- 22. Australian verse any Australian poet any style ballad, narrative, lyric, satire, humorous.

#### **VOLUNTEERS**

The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Inc. operates solely with volunteers. Their help and assistance is priceless in the roles they fill from backstage, organization, ticket sales, announcers and runners. We appreciate your offer of assistance in filling any of the roles, as without volunteers we would not be able to successfully run the eisteddfod. Please advise the convenor via email if you are able to help in any of the positions in either Music, Dance or Speech and Drama.

#### **CODE OF ETHICS**

Performers are expected to afford the same consideration to other entrants as they would expect for themselves. To ensure that adequate consideration is given, we ask that you understand and abide by the following rules:

- Give due acclaim and encouragement to each other in the spirit of friendship that the Eisteddfod movement has fostered over the years.
- Do not attempt to intimidate or distract a performer at any time.
- Remain seated while a performance is in progress.
- Maintain silence from the time that a performer appears on stage until the end of the performance.

#### **DRESS CODE**

The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Society Inc. supports a Dress Code for all performers throughout the Eisteddfod. All parents and teachers are urged to observe this standard of dress. Good casual is suitable for day competition.

#### **AUDITORIUM RULES**

#### **SILENCE**

Members of the audience are requested to maintain silence and to remain seated during performances, adjudications and announcements. Doors will be closed and entry to or exit from the venue will not be permitted during performances.

#### PHOTOGRAPHY/RECORDING

Under copyright law and child protection requirements, the use of cameras (including mobile phones and cameras), video recorders, cassette recorders or MP3 recorders is **forbidden**, unless specifically authorized by The Ipswich Junior Eisteddfod Society Inc. for official/publicity purposes.

#### **MOBILE PHONES/PAGERS**

All mobile phones and pagers must be switched off or placed on silent.
